



Eligibility and Deadlines

Who May Enter? The Spelling Bee is open to all 4th-8th grade public, private, parochial, home and charter school students in the 38-county Dallas region.* More than 600 schools participated at the classroom level in the 2010 Dallas Morning News Regional Spelling Bee.

The Dallas region is made up of 38 North and East Texas counties. These counties include: Anderson, Bowie, Camp, Cass, Cherokee, Collin, Cooke, Dallas, Delta, Denton, Ellis, Fannin, Franklin, Freestone, Grayson, Gregg, Harrison, Henderson, Hill, Hopkins, Hunt, Kaufman, Lamar, Limestone, Marion, Morris, Navarro, Panola, Rains, Red River, Rockwall, Rusk, Shelby, Smith, Titus, Upshur, Van Zandt and Wood.

Each county may send one champion to the Regional Spelling Bee, except Dallas County, which may send two champions — one each from the public schools and private schools.

The regional champion will win an all-expense paid trip (plus airfare for two parents) to Washington, D.C., to compete in the National Spelling Bee.

Enrollment will take place at Scripps National website www.spellingbee.com from August 17 through October 15, 2010. Scripps has incorporated an enrollment fee for each school involved at any level of the bee. This enrollment covers all study guide costs. * Eligible 4th-8th grade students include only those who have not reached their 15th birthday on or before August 31, 2010. Students must not have passed beyond the 8th grade on or before February 1, 2011. Students must attend a school enrolled to participate in the Regional Spelling Bee.

** Your county may require an additional district spelloff, in which your school champion may have to compete in additional levels to determine who will move on to the County Bee. You will be contacted directly by a district coordinator if this process affects your school.
